

## Notice of Roy City's Municipal Election

Roy City will be holding a municipal election this fall for mayor and two four-year city council seats. The primary election (if enough candidates file for office) will be September 15, 2009, and the November election will be November 3, 2009. Persons interested in running for office should personally come in to the Roy City Offices weekdays during regular business hours between July 1 and July 15, with the deadline being 5:00 p.m. on July 15, and file a Declaration of Candidacy form and pay a \$25 filing fee or file a petition signed by 25 currently registered valid Roy City voters in support of their candidacy. Candidates must be United States citizens, registered voters of Roy City, Roy residents or residents of the recently annexed area for 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of the election; and not be a convicted felon, unless their right to vote has been restored.

### Voter Registration Required to Vote

Residents who have moved into the City or from one address to another within the City should register to vote. The Weber County Clerk's Office handles voter registration. You can register to vote in person at the Weber County Clerk's Office at 2380 Washington Boulevard in Ogden or by mailing in a voter registration form. There is a voter registration form in the front of the Dex phone book or you can pick one up at the Roy City Offices.

### ID Required to Vote

There is a new law that requires voters to present valid identification when they vote. The following are acceptable forms of valid identification:

**Present One of the following forms of ID that bears the name and photograph of the voter:**

- Currently valid Utah Driver's license
- A currently valid identification card issued by:
  - The State of Utah
  - A branch, department, or agency of the United States
- A currently valid Utah permit to carry a concealed weapon
- A valid United States passport
- A valid Tribal Identification Card, whether or not the card includes a photograph of the voter

**Or**

**Present Two of the following forms of identification that bears the name of the voter and provides evidence that the voter resides within the voting precinct:**

- Current utility bill or a legible copy (dated within 90 days before the election)
- A bank or other financial account statement, or legible copy
- A certified birth certificate
- A valid social security card
- A check issued by the state or the federal government, or legible copy thereof
- A paycheck from the voter's employer, or a legible copy
- A valid Utah Hunting or Fishing license
- A currently valid United States military I.D. card

- Certified naturalization documentation
- A valid license issued by an authorized agency of the United States
- A certified copy of court records showing the voter's adoption or name change
- A Bureau of Indian Affairs card
- A tribal treaty Card
- Valid Medicaid card, Medicare card, or Electronic Benefits Transfer Card
- A currently valid identification card issued by:
  - A local government within the State of Utah
  - An employer for an employee
  - A college, university, technical school, or professional school located within the State of Utah

**Note:** If a valid form of identification listed under Section A above does not contain a photograph of the voter, then one other form of identification listed in Section B must be included.

Voters who do not present proper identification at the polls may vote using a provisional ballot; however, the provisional ballot will not count unless they provide valid voter identification at the Weber County Clerk's Office within 5 days after the election.

If one's income falls below the federal poverty guideline issued by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, he or she can receive a free identification card from the driver license division.
