

ROY CITY PARKS & RECREATION FACILITIES

Municipal Park

2275 W. 5900 So.

It has 9.24 acres and currently has the following facilities; playground, bowery, two tennis courts with one multipurpose basketball court, restrooms, soccer playing field, softball T-Ball playing fields, walking trail, and parking facilities.

Sand Ridge Park

2100 W. 4475 So.

It has 12.29 acres and comprised of the following facilities; restrooms, lighted baseball diamond, soccer/football field, bowery, and basin, playground area, parking facilities, running water fall and creek bed, excellent location for family photos.

North Park (George Wahlen)

1925 W. 4200 So.

It has 12.68 acres and is comprised of the following facilities: tennis courts, multipurpose basketball court, (allow tennis as well), triplex T-Ball field, softball field with backstop, sand volleyball, large pavilion (bowery), and parking facilities.

Roy Park (Frank Tremea)

2700 W. 5525 So.

It has 5.60 acres and has the following facilities: lighted baseball diamond, concession stand, restrooms, and permanent bleachers.

Roy West Park

2900 W. 4650 So.

It has 27.47 acres and is comprised of the following facilities: Two T-Ball fields, of which one is lighted, two softball/ baseball fields, which are lighted, and have scoreboards and concession stands, two soccer fields with scoreboards, bleachers, restrooms, concession stand, and walking track. The North end of the park has two boweries, two tennis courts, one sand volleyball pit, Skateboard Park and playground.

South West Park (Emma Russell)

4300 W. 5700 So.

It has 35 acres. There is a detention basin, a grassy area where informal soccer is played and equestrian area. Under construction is soccer complex, bowery, walking path, restroom facility, softball field and multipurpose fields. The estimated time of completion Spring 2007.

Foxglen Community Park

3900 W. 4600 So.

It has 3.12 acres and is comprised of the following facilities: T-ball field, bowery and playground.

Meadow Creek Village Park (Roger Burnett)

4200 W. 5075 So.

It has 4.57 acres. It is primarily a detention basin with a pond, playground, walkway, fishing pond and restrooms. This park also serves as the trail head for the Howard Slough Parkway.

McCall Fields (Lease) Park

3239 W. 5600 So.

It has 1.58 acres which are located under the UP&L power transmission line corridor. The park is planted in grass and is used mostly as an informal soccer field.

Vern W. Thompson Heritage Park/Garden

5600 So. Frontage Road

This park and garden is located at the northwest quadrant of I-15 East frontage road and 5600 South, and is about three quarters of an acre in size. This is the only park with Roy City ties which is not located within the city limits of Roy, since it is located just east of the city limits in Riverdale. This property is leased by the Roy Historical Museum from the Roy Water Conservancy Sub-District, which has its facilities adjacent to, and immediately north of the, Heritage Park. The Park has a picnic bowery, a four fountain pond and crossing foot bridge, waterfall, flower beds and other landscaping.

Recreation and Parks Offices

2626 W. 5525 So.

Recreation and Parks office is located adjacent to, and immediately north of Roy Park (Frank Tremea). It is located on 2.732 acres. The site is for the City Parks and Recreation Administration. The administration building is about 2500 square feet in size and accommodates the parks/recreation administrative offices; athletic equipment storage, restrooms, kitchen, bowery, and multipurpose room that is rented to the public (call 774-1048 for information). The property is mostly grass and a few trees.

BMX (Bike) Track

2500 W. 5600 So.

The track is open year round. Motorized vehicles are prohibited on the track. It can be accessed from the east side of the 5600 South overpass.

Roy Recreation Complex

2150 W. 4700 So.

The Roy City Recreation Complex was built in 1973. This complex is located adjacent to both Roy High School and Sand Ridge Junior High School. The complex has 30,000 square feet of space and includes the following facilities: T-shaped indoor swimming pool with diving board, mens/womens locker rooms, showers, and saunas, 7,000 square foot multipurpose room, one full court basketball court, two racquetball courts, indoor track, a 2,000 square foot weight training room, a 1,750 square foot aerobics room. A variety of programs are offered at the complex, including: aerobics (step, toning, and water aerobics), swimming lessons are offered year round, and private lessons. Roy High School swim team uses the swimming pool and the weight room during certain times of the day.

Roy Aquatic Center

2977 W. 5525 S.

The Aquatic Center was built in 2003. The Center consists of three pools, two thirty foot water slides, and two diving boards. The Aquatic Center is a seasonal pool. The season begins Memorial Day and ends Labor Day. The first pool is a padded shallow wading pool with interactive spray toys and a slide for children. This pool is great for small children and parents. The second and most popular pool is the large leisure pool. This pool has a zero depth entry and in the middle of the pool is a large water play feature. Connected to the leisure pool are thirty foot water slides. The third and final pool is a large 25 yard lap pool with a high and low dive. The Aquatic Center offers fun for all ages to enjoy. Facility can be rent3d after hours for a price. Roy City Cemetery

2300 W. 5300 So.

The cemetery is about 5 acres in size. The cemetery is comprised of four plats consisting of a total of 2400 grave sites. As of the spring of 2006, about 1595 deceased persons were buried in the cemetery. The cemetery was dedicated July 2, 1904, and there are gravestones that date back to the year 1907. The cemetery is essentially comprised of an old section, where most of the graves of the deceased are currently located, and a new section, where still a considerable amount of capacity remains. The old section contains several mature trees, whereas the new section has little landscaping, other then grass.
