Mayor Ritchie welcomed all of the students from the Roy High School Government class.

1. APPROVAL OF MARCH 15, 2011, MINUTES

Councilman Stokes moved to approve the minutes of March 15, 2011, as written. Councilman Hilton seconded the motion. Council members Cragun, Hilton, Peterson, and Stokes voted "aye." The motion carried.

2. PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were none.

3. CONSIDERATION OF AN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE LICENSE FOR MS AND SONS, INC., (DBA) MIDLAND MARKET LOCATED AT 3805 SOUTH MIDLAND DRIVE

Mayor Ritchie stated that Midland Market had had a change of ownership. The prior owner had an alcoholic beverage license. The new owner had met the requirements for a license.

Councilman Cragun moved to approve an alcoholic beverage license for MS and Sons, Inc. (DBA) Midland Market located at 3805 South Midland Drive. Councilman Stokes seconded the motion. Council members Cragun, Hilton, Peterson, and Stokes voted “aye.” The motion carried.

4. RECOGNITION OF THE MARCH 2011 EMPLOYEES OF THE MONTH

Mayor Ritchie stated that Fire Chief Jon Ritchie had nominated Captain Doug Fife, Ryan Law, Jason Tyler, Matt Heslop, Colin Ward, Lewis Weaver, and Jeremy Barker as March 2011 Employees of the Month. On March 25, 2011, a male patient in his early 50's complaining of chest pains walked into the Roy City Fire Department. The difference in this particular call was that the patient was Guy Forsberg, a Roy City Firefighter. Guy came to the station to see if the paramedics would patch him up to the cardiac monitor and assess his vitals. Captain Doug Fife and Engineer Ryan Law started assessing Guy's vitals. Rescue 31 and Ambulance 31 were already on call. Because Guy was experiencing chest pains, Captain Fife requested that Rescue 31 return to the station. Upon Rescue 31's arrival, Guy's vitals showed he had elevated blood pressure, pulse was tachycardia, increased respirations, and he was extremely agitated. As soon as the paramedics (Jason Tyler, Matt Heslop, and medic student Jeremy Barker) asked him what was going on, Guy collapsed on the ambulance gurney. The cardiac monitor was already in the process of being attached. As soon as the paramedics saw the cardiac rhythm, they immediately checked for a pulse, and Jeremy started CPR. Because Guy was one of their own everyone was a little apprehensive, not Jeremy. Within seconds of this event, Guy was immediately defibrillated and high flow oxygen was placed on him to support good air exchange. Shortly after paramedics started running the code, they were able to get a heart rate back with spontaneous respirations. This type of heart attack is considered the “Widow Maker.” There is a very slim chance of survival. In twenty-nine years of providing EMS services to Roy City, Chief Ritchie had only witnessed three full cardiac arrest saves; this was number four. Thanks to the quick response and actions of Shift “A” Team that day, Guy was doing well, was released after three days, and was resting at home with family. The crew handled themselves very professionally, even with the added stress of it being one of their brother firefighters. This was the type of professionalism that was demonstrated on a daily basis by the personnel of the Roy City Fire Department. Chief Ritchie could not be more proud of this great group of guys, especially “A” shift.

Fire Chief Jon Ritchie thanked the Mayor and City Council for recognizing the “A” Team. They saved lives every day. It was different when you were working on one of your own. By the time Guy arrived at the emergency room he was sitting up and talking, which was a miracle. With a “Widow Maker” heart attack, there was only a one minute window of opportunity. This recognition was a small way to thank these men. He was very proud of them and all of Roy City's firefighters.

Councilman Peterson moved to recognize Captain Doug Fife, Ryan Law, Jason Tyler, Matt Heslop, Colin Ward, Lewis Weaver, and Jeremy Barker as the March 2011 Employees of the Month. Councilman Cragun seconded the motion. Council members Cragun, Hilton, Peterson, Stokes, and Tafoya voted “aye.” The motion carried.

Mayor Ritchie presented Ryan Law, Jason Tyler, Matt Heslop, Colin Ward, and Jeremy Barker with recognition plaques and checks. Captain Fife was on sick leave and Lewis Weaver had another commitment.

Councilman Hilton stated that he dealt with “Widow Maker” heart attacks every day and had been in the position of having to work on one of his own. You had a different perspective when it was one of your own.

Councilman Stokes stated that he had been in the operating room every day for years. He had experienced the trauma of having to work on a fellow staff member. It created a different level of fear. It was hard to keep calm and focused when it was one of your peers.

Councilman Cragun felt it would be really tough to work on a fellow employee. He had the experience of having the paramedics respond to his call. They were very professional. Every city needed to have this type of personnel. He commended the Roy City firefighters for their training and how they cared for the citizens of the community.

Councilman Peterson stated that Chief Ritchie bragged that Roy City had the best firefighters in the state and country. This event showed who they were. Their response spoke well of their training and alertness. He appreciated the job they did.

5. CONSIDERATION OF AN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE LICENSE FOR LILLIE ENTERPRISES (DBA) ROY SINCLAIR LOCATED AT 5608 SOUTH 1900 WEST

Mayor Ritchie stated that the Sinclair Station at 5608 South 1900 West had had a change of ownership. The prior owner had an alcoholic beverage license. The new owner had met the requirements for a license.

Councilman Stokes stated that it seemed the Council considered a new alcoholic beverage license for this business every few months due to an ownership change. He wasn't concerned about issuing the license, but wondered if there was a pattern developing.

Tony Reynolds, Community and Economic Development Director, stated that the petitioner was Ron Lillie. He operated the Sinclair station from 2006 to the end of 2010. He

subleased the businesses to another operator. The sublease failed, and Mr. Lillie was asking for a new alcoholic beverage license.

Councilman Stokes moved to approve an alcoholic beverage license for Lillie Enterprise (DBA) Roy Sinclair located at 5608 South 1900 West. Councilman Hilton seconded the motion. Council members Cragun, Hilton, Peterson, and Stokes voted "aye." The motion carried.

6. CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

Chris Davis reminded the Council members about a meeting the local legislators on Wednesday, April 6, at the Hope Community Center. Four legislators would attend and planned to discuss redistricting.

Chris Davis reminded the Council about Utah League of Cities and Towns the week of April 11th.

Chris Davis stated that the administrative staff had started working on the FY2012 budget.

7. MAYOR AND COUNCIL REPORTS

Councilman Cragun stated that a gentleman at the Town Meeting brought up a concern regarding code enforcement. He recently purchased an existing home on 5600 South and was cited for code violations. Councilman Cragun felt language needed to be added to the ordinance to give a new owner of an existing home time to bring it up to code. Councilman Stokes said the Council made that change in a recent amendment to the Zoning Ordinance. New owners of existing homes had a period of time to bring it into compliance, similar to that of new homes. Councilman Hilton felt the Code Enforcement Officer might need some training on the new ordinance. Councilman Cragun felt part of the problem was neighbor's expecting an immediate resolution when a new owner moved in.

Councilman Peterson felt the public meeting regarding the General Plan had been well attended and that the City had received great input. He commended Jared Hall for his work. The General Plan was a land use plan. He suggested that the City Council hold a strategic planning work session to consider what would happen in Roy over the next five to ten years. Then intermediate steps could be planned. It would also help the staff with the budget. Councilman Stokes felt it would be helpful to see what money was needed for future plans. The department heads could help prioritize things.

Councilman Hilton said he had attended the planning meeting as well and felt the City had received good comments. He also felt the Town Meeting was well attended and that some problems had been resolved.

Councilman Hilton stated that he had received a call from a property owner who lived next to McCall Fields. Because the park did not have a restroom, children were using his backyard as a lavatory. Chris Davis said the City was trying to get a port-a-potty. He would check on its status and email the Council.
