From the Roy City Manager

As the new city manager in Roy, Utah, I want to start these introductory remarks by expressing my gratitude for the opportunity to be here in wonderful city that you all call home

As a city manager, on a daily basis I have the chance to help make life better for people in their hometown. To me, that charge is an honor and a privilege, and I am excited to have that opportunity here in Roy. I see a community with a lot of great opportunities to make some really wonderful things happen for the people who live here. I look forward to building upon the foundation that has been laid by the people of Roy, and enhancing the quality of life for everyone here in our great city.

I have been working in government for over a decade, and most of that time has been with various cities in the western United States. After graduating from Brigham Young University with a Master's Degree in Public Administration, my wife and I moved to Phoenix, Arizona where I worked for the Governor's budget office. I learned soon thereafter that I preferred working for cities because I feel that at the municipal level you are closest to the people who will be affected by your decisions the most. With my background in government finance, I was able to secure a position with a suburb of Phoenix in the finance and budget department. There, I was able to develop skills and talents on the financial side of things and help keep services to our citizens moving during the heaviest part of the recession in a state that was one of the hardest hit by the downturn in the economy. After that, I moved on to a larger city in the Phoenix area to work in the city manager's office where I was mentored by some fantastic individuals in the many areas that an aspiring city manager needs training.

Eventually, my career path took me and my family from the sunny southwest to the

rainy northwest of coastal Oregon (in full disclosure, I grew up in the Seattle area), where I served as the city manager of Toledo, Oregon. If I had to list a few things that I am most proud of accomplishing there, I would have to say that revising the city's budgeting process and budget document for efficiency and transparency would be at the top of that list. By connecting funding in the budget to the goals that the city would be accomplishing over the next year, citizens were able to see much more clearly what their tax dollars were going toward and how their community would be improved because of our efforts. The budget document itself went from a collection of spreadsheets, numbers, and charts to a tool to communicate with our citizens our work plan and how we would be held accountable. Our efforts in creating a better, more transparent budgeting process built trust and support in the community by throwing some sunlight on an often confusing process (the cloudy Oregon coast weather notwithstanding).

My decision to come to Roy was heavily influenced by my desire to move our family closer to our extended family. My wife, Kristin, grew up in Kaysville and we have spent so much time in the Davis/Weber County area over the last 14 years that coming back to this area has truly felt like returning home to me. We are thrilled to live in this beautiful area of the best state in the nation and share with our four children all that it has to offer.

In closing, I would like to end my remarks by making a promise to you, citizens of Roy that I will work with the city council, city staff, and you to ensure that Roy City is always a place that you feel excited to come home to.

Tree Lighting Ceremony



Cemetery Winter Maintenance Schedule

November 1st to March 31st

No decorations will be removed in November and December. Grave decorations will be removed by City crews on the last Thursday of January, February, and March. Please be sure to remove decorations by the last Wednesday evening of each month to avoid having them disposed of.

Sidewalk Snow Removal

In compliance with Roy City Code, Title 4-3-1, citizens are reminded to keep the sidewalks clear of snow and ice, within twelve (12) hours from the termination of the depositing storm, and to not deposit snow or other materials in the city streets. Snow deposited into the street from one residence ends up in the neighbor's

driveway approach as the plows clear the streets for safe vehicle passage. Please deposit snow in park strips where available or on grassy areas where the melting snow can safely and naturally filter through the soil.



Winter Parking Ordinance

Roy City winter parking regulations will be in effect at 1:00 a.m. on November 15th. On-street parking from 1:00 a.m. - 7:00 a.m. is prohibited in Roy City from November 15th through March 15th regardless of weather. These restrictions are designed primarily to enhance snow and ice control efforts and to prevent



accidents with parked cars. Please make every effort to comply with this ordinance. Violators will be subject to fines of \$35.00 or more. Please also note that it is a violation to place any structure in the street that impedes plows

or traffic. This ordinance is in effect year-round and includes, but is not limited to; basketball standards, landscaping material, trailers, etc.

We appreciate your cooperation in complying with these ordinances to make our streets safer.
