You can drop the shoes off at the offices of Freedom Elementary & Roy High School.

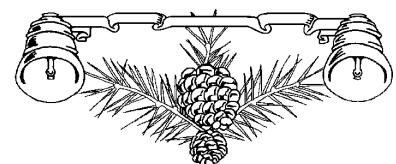

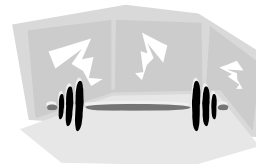

Cemetery Winter Maintenance Schedule

November 1st to March 31st

No decorations will be removed in November and December. Grave decorations will be removed by City crews on the last Thursday of January, February, and March. Please be sure to remove decorations by the last Wednesday evening of each month to avoid having them disposed of.

Winter Parking Ordinance

Roy City winter parking regulations will be in effect at 1:00 a.m. on November 15th. On-street parking from 1:00 a.m. - 7:00 a.m. is prohibited in Roy City from November 15th through March 15th regardless of weather. These restrictions are designed primarily to enhance snow and ice control efforts and to prevent accidents with parked cars.

Please make every effort to comply with this ordinance. Violators will be subject to fines of \$35.00 or more. Please also note that it is a violation to place any structure in the street that impedes plows or traffic. This ordinance is in effect year-round and includes, but is not limited to; basketball standards, landscaping material, trailers, etc.

We appreciate your cooperation in complying with these ordinances to make our streets safer.

The Ogden Weber Community Action Partnership - (OWCAP)

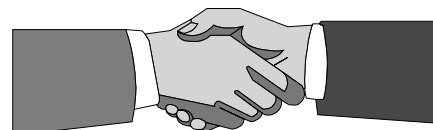

NOTICE OF THE ADOPTION OF A BUDGET THAT INCLUDES THE TRANSFER OF MONEY FROM ENTERPRISE FUNDS TO OTHER FUNDS

In accordance with Utah Code §10-6-135.5, the Roy City Council adopted an amendment to its FY 2018 fiscal budget on September 19, 2017. The amendment includes transfers from the City's Enterprise Funds to the General Fund, Information Technology Fund, Risk Management Fund, and other Enterprise Funds. The Enterprise Funds include the Water and Sewer Utility, Storm Water Utility, and Solid Waste Utility. Notice of the transfers was provided to users of the utilities and the City Council held a separate public hearing to receive citizen input on the transfers.

The FY 2018 Roy City Budget includes transfers from the Utility Enterprise Funds to the General Fund, Information Technology Fund, and Risk Management Fund for shared administrative personnel costs and overhead. In addition, the Storm Water Utility transfers monies to the Water and Sewer Utility for shared personnel and overhead costs, and the Solid Waste Utility transfers monies to the Water and Sewer Utility and Storm Water Utility for the same purpose. Within the City of Roy, Utility Funds are operated as a business. Businesses require management, legal, finance, maintenance, and other personnel to operate effectively. In order to keep costs down in the Utility Enterprise Funds, they share personnel with other funds of the City.

These transfers have been done by the City for a number of years. Recent state law changes now require that the City provide notice to its citizens of the transfers as a part of the budget process. The amount of the transfers and the funds impacted are as follows:
